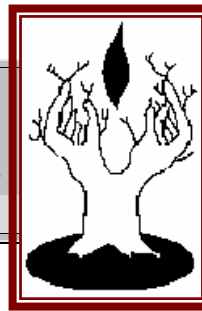

**From the desk of Ken Iobst**

The following test does not measure your intelligence, your fluency with the words, and certainly not your mathematical ability. It will, however, give you some gauge of your mental flexibility and creativity. In the three years since we developed the test, we've found few people who could solve more than half the 24 questions on the first try.
