## MONDAY – July 16th

- (1) **Dutch Springs Water Park.** A tamer alternative to the Wednesday rafting trip. A variety of people powered water rides and swimming in a spring filled quarry. There is also a climbing wall and a ropes course. If our group is 10-35 people: Age 10 and over: \$18, under 10: \$10, under 5 free. Drive Time: 30 min. - (2) **Martin Guitar Company.** As a visitor on the factory floor, your guided tour will show you how our guitars come to life through the hands of the crafts person. Explore the art of guitar making, from old world tools to our state-of-the-art facility. Follow a guitar from rough lumber to a finished product which requires more than 300 steps to complete. Tours last approximately one hour. Photographs are allowed without a flash. Video cameras, recorders or cell phones are not permitted. Closed-toe shoes are recommended. - (3) **Group Bike Ride.** Join us on the Saucon Valley Rails to Trails Bike Route only ¼ mile from DeSales University. Take a 6 mile bike hike to the Hellertown Historical Society and back on this safe, beautiful trail that is walking distance from DeSales. Possible tour of the old mill at the historical Society, but also a beautiful park to rest before heading back to DeSales. Kids 14 and under must be accompanied by adult and smaller children may turn around with supervisor and head home at any time. Also relatively flat ride. No Charge.

## TUESDAY – July 17

- (1) **Bucks County Moravian Pottery and Tile Works.** The Moravian Pottery and Tile Works, a National Historic Landmark, is maintained as a "working history" museum by Pennsylvania's County of Bucks, Department of Parks and Recreation. Handmade tiles are still produced in a manner similar to that developed by the pottery's founder and builder, Henry Chapman Mercer (1856-1930). Mercer was a major proponent of the Arts & Crafts Movement in America. He directed the work at the pottery from 1898 until his death in 1930. Visitors will see original installations, various displays, and selected aspects of current tile production. Short Video and then self guided tour (about 45 min) Adults 60 and over \$3.50, Adults under 60 \$4.50, 7-17 \$2.50, 7 and under free. (25% AAA discount if show card.) - (2) **Fonhill Castle.** Visit the home of Henry Mercer (1856-1930) Mercer was a major proponent of the Arts & Crafts Movement in America. This 1 hour guided tour will open your eyes to the imagination and construction of his beautiful home. This house is not air conditioned. <http://www.fonhillmuseum.org/> For 10 or more people: adult \$8.50, child \$3.50. Drive time 45 min. (This is on the same property as Moravian Pottery and Tile Works. See #1 above)

- (3) **Dorney Park and Wildwater Kingdom.** Amusement park known for roller coasters and water slides. Activities in the park and at Camp Snoopy for younger children. Pay with registration. \$23/person. Pay with registration. Drive time: 25 min. [www.dorneypark.com](http://www.dorneypark.com)
- (4) **America On Wheels.** All ages will enjoy this unique collection of bicycles, automobiles, trucks and other vehicles that demonstrate the vehicle heritage of the United States. Exhibits range from the latest in personal transportation vehicles, such as scooters and Segways, to the grand Mack Trucks that help feed and supply a growing country. ## WEDNESDAY-- July 18

- (1) **Rafting.** Rafting down the Lehigh River is UUMAC's most popular activity! The rafting company provides buses and lunch. You must be 5 years old to go on this trip. Please pay with registration. \$36.95 per person. Departs PROMPTLY at noon and returns by approx. 5:30pm.
- (2) **Lost River Caverns.** Come with us on an adventure through Lost River Caverns, nature's underground limestone wonderland. The temperature is a constant 52 degrees, so you'll need a sweater or jacket. Bring your camera too! There's a lot to discover in this magical land of crystal formations where the Lost River flows. - (3) **Mercer Museum.** By 1897 handmade objects were being discarded in favor of new machine-made goods. Historian and archaeologist Henry Mercer (1856-1930) recognized the need to collect and preserve the outmoded material of daily life in America before it was swept away by the Industrial Revolution. Mercer gathered almost 30,000 items ranging from hand tools to horse-drawn vehicles and assembled this encyclopedic collection in a system of his own devising. To enhance the collection's educational value, and to share it with the public, Mercer decided to design and build a museum to display the artifacts. New Exhibit will be "Hunt for Treasure" featuring archeology and all different ways people look for "treasures" - many hands of activities. Newer part of the building is air conditioned. For groups of 10 or more: Adults \$8.00, Children \$3.50. Drive time 45 minutes. (A combo ticket of Fonthill Castle and Mercer Museum can be purchased.
